For citations of references, we prefer the use of square brackets and consecutive numbers. Citations using labels or the author/year convention are also acceptable. The following bibliography provides a sample reference list with entries for journal articles [2], an LNCS chapter [5], a book [3], proceedings without editors [4], and a homepage [1]. Multiple citations are grouped [2,5,3], [2,3,4,1].
